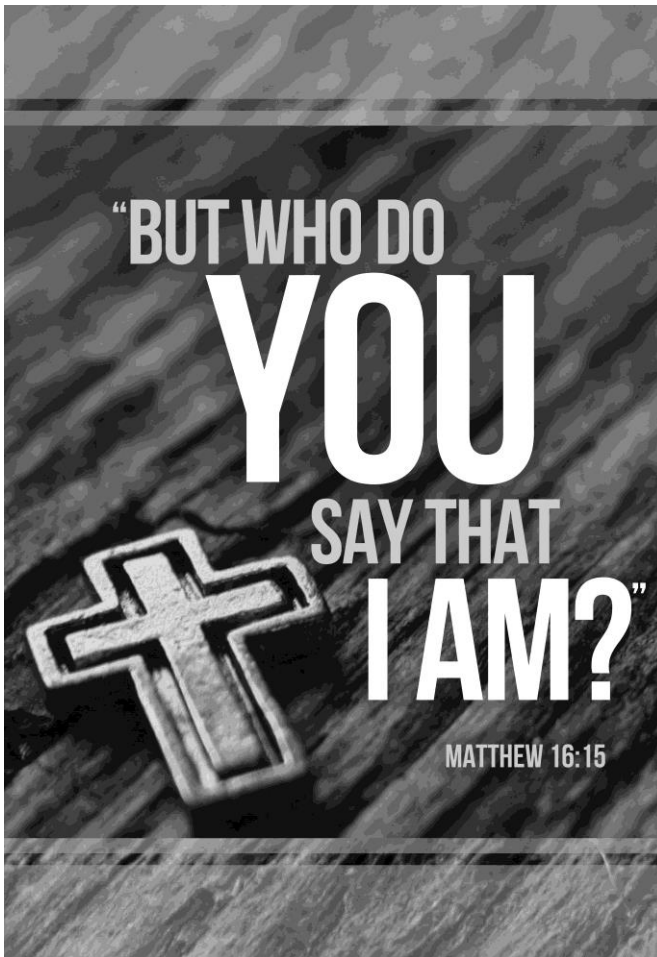

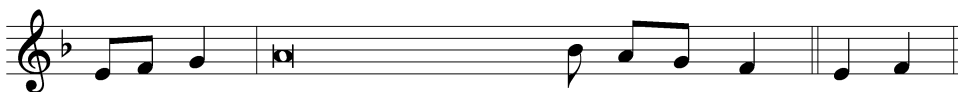

Romans 10:5–13

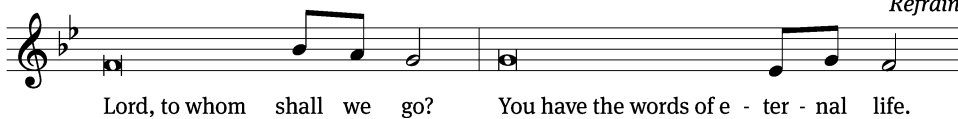



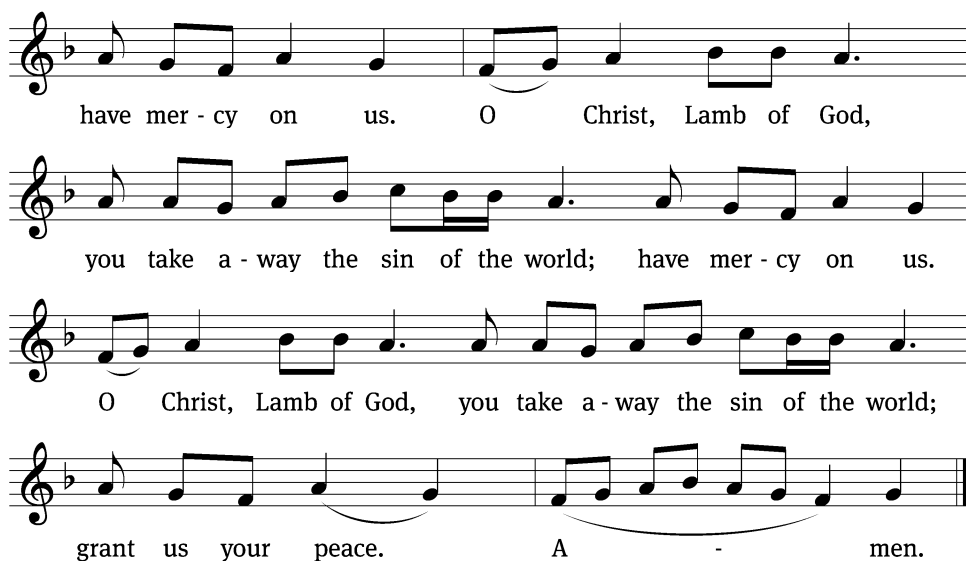
